Triduum

The term triduum means 'three days.' The three days are counted as the Hebrews counted their days, from dusk to dusk.

Therefore, the three days of the Easter triduum are from dusk on Holy Thursday to dusk on Good Friday (day one), dusk on Good Friday to dusk on Holy Saturday (day two), and dusk on Holy Saturday to dusk on Easter Sunday (day three).

Each of those days 'tells' a different part of the story of Jesus' saving action. We look at the East Triduum as on single celebration that lasts for three days.

We cannot separate the death of Jesus from his resurrection. We do not spend all the three days in church, but at various times during those days, we are called to church to gather and remember together.
